Taiwan: Recognition by ten more countries possible

Today, the non-profit advocacy group YKON revealed that it has been secretly negotiating with a number of Microstates and Micronations on full recognition of the sovereignty and independence of Taiwan. Ten out of 35 countries said they would grant recognition, either unconditionally or after certain requirements are met. The negotiations were held on behalf of an undisclosed Taiwan-based organisation.

“This could be an important milestone on the road to Taiwan’s re-entry to the United Nations,” YKON spokesperson Tomas Träskman said. “We hope Taiwan will take this generous offer seriously and enter into formal negotiations with the Group of Ten.”

The proposals are being presented to the public at MOCA Taipei between December 2, 2006 and February 4, 2007. Taiwanese citizens can also express their support for negotiations with the Group of Ten by signing a petition on display at MOCA.
